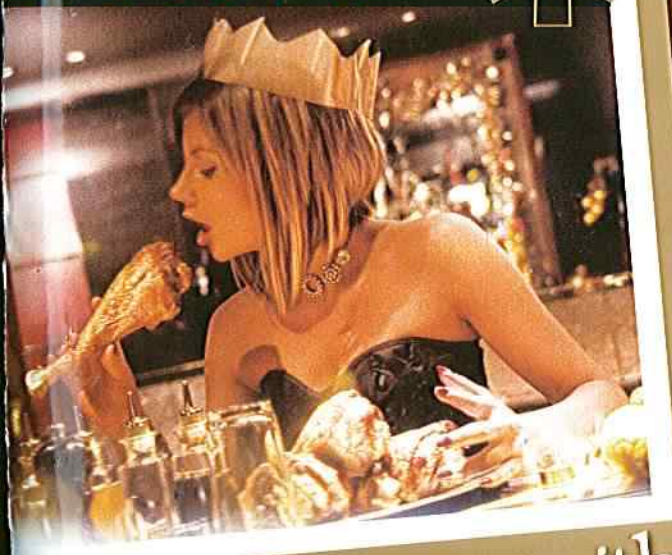

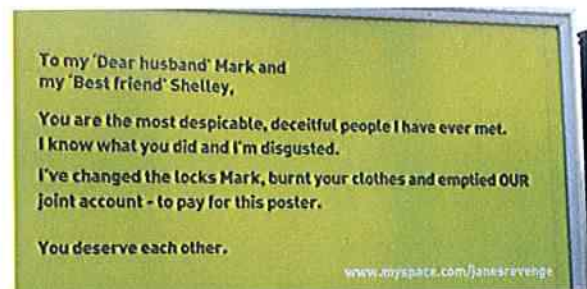
MARRIAGE
